- Creating Mood

- Either use a video I will provide or one you shot yourself, create mood with color

- Example: *Shoot University Hall during the day, but change the color to be grayish and blueish to make it spookier.*

- Have fun with this one! I want to see you get creative (you can include text if you'd like as well)

- Using audio tags and audio tracks, edit audio

- Change the mood! Make the audio crisper!

There are so many ways you can make audio some different, so get creative

- How to mask certain objects
 - Keyframes
 - Feathering
- Color Mattes

- Using video you find online or by shooting your own, edit at least 30 seconds of video to completely hide the identity of a subject in the video

- Using a color matte and keyframes, reveal the identity of a hidden video or picture
